# Hatley Water Tower Refurbishing Completed.

The repainted/refurbished Hatley Water Tower Project was completed in early July. The interior and exterior refurbishing and painting along with the piping leaks and other DNR noted deficiencies were completed for a total cost of \$162,000. The tower has a new fresh red, white and blue color paint job. The Hatley identification is in a new font, painted in red making it more visible from a further distance. ### Come Ride the Newest Mountain Bike Trail System in Central WI – Ringle Trails!

Boasting 10+ miles of fun, flowy singletrack trail weaving through the beautiful glacial moraine landscape in Ringle, WI.



Ringle Trails is machine-built "flow" trail that is hard-packed and smooth with very few technical root or rocky sections, making it a great riding experience for beginner and intermediate riders. Scattered throughout the trails are numerous optional "b-lines" that feature rock drops, gap jumps, and technical rock sections that will challenge even the most advanced rider.

Located at Marathon County Solid Waste (172900 State Highway 29, Ringle, WI 54471), the main trailhead and parking area is easily accessible from Hwy 29.

Thanks to the efforts of the Central Wisconsin Offroad Cycling Coalition (CWOCC) and the Marathon County Solid Waste Department the trails are free to the public!

# **Update on Former Veener Mill Redevelopment Project.**

The project encountered some delays primarily due to beyond normal amounts of rain fall and wet conditions delaying street paving as well as finishing grading and site restoration work. The good news is the street is finished and the site restoration is nearing completion. The Village has entered into a developers agreement with a local developer, namely Harvey G. Fraaza who agrees to purchase lots and construct through a three -phased development process of six residential side-by side duplex housing units for persons that are age 62 and older. The developer has obtained building permits to start the construction of the first two units. The subdivision will be identified as River's Edge Country Living Estates. The duplexes will be developer owned, therefore, anyone interested in renting and availability information can contact the developer direct at 715-446-2807.

A permit must be acquired prior to starting installation of the fencing and must comply with the ordinance fencing codes.
