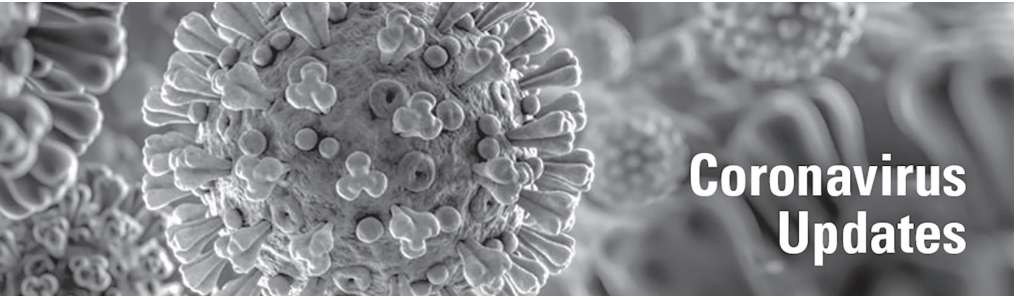
Play & Learn is held every Thursday from 10-11:30a.m. Children's Hospital of WI staff provide interactive fun, stories, music and games for preschool age children.

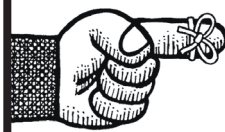

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:

The Village board continues to receive complaints about dogs running loose and barking excessively. Owners of unleashed dogs running at large are subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$100.00, together with impoundment. (See Section 7-1-6 (b) 4 of Village of Hatley Code of Ordinances). Proper pet responsibility, and common courtesy, requires you to keep your dogs on your property or leashed when not on your property. Please be considerate of other residents. You are required to license your dog in the Village of Hatley. Contact Village Treasurer, Joe Szews at 715-446-2209 for dog licenses.

VILLAGE BURNING GUIDELINES

Fire pits for campfires are allowed. Other burning is regulated by the DNR. An annual burning permit is required (available at P K Slammers, Pike Lake or Esker's Town & Country, Wittenberg). Then you must call 1-888-WISBURN each time before you burn to determine if there are any restrictions in the proposed burn area. Complete details are available at dnr.wi.gov/forestry/fire. Please burn only after 6 p.m. No burning on Sundays. Burning of household garbage & recyclables is strictly prohibited.

BUILDING PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR ANY WORK VALUED OVER \$500

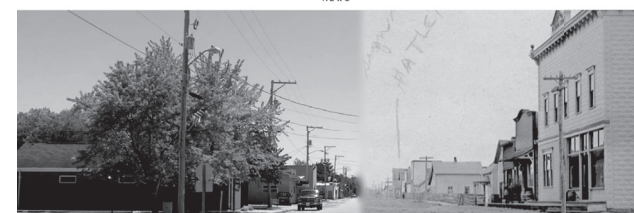
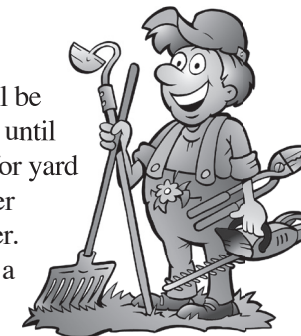
VILLAGE OF HATLEY
