ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:

The Village board continues to receive complaints about dogs running loose and barking excessively. Owners of unleashed dogs running at large are subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$100.00, together with impoundment. (See Section 7-1-6 (b) 4 of Village of Hatley Code of Ordinances). Proper pet responsibility, and common courtesy requires you to keep your dogs on your property or leashed when not on your property. Please be considerate of other residents. You are required to license your dog in the Village of Hatley. Contact Village Treasurer, Joe Szews at 715-581-2259 for dog licenses.

BUILDING PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR ANY WORK VALUED OVER \$500

Please contact Zoning Administrator Bill Karschney at 446-3571 for your permit or to inquire if a permit is needed for your project.

NO WIPES DOWN THE PIPES!!!

Help your community and protect our Sewer System! Putting ANY of the items on the following list down toilets may plug sewers and cause raw sewage to back up into your home!

PLACE THESE ITEMS IN THE TRASH:

- Disposable and "Flushable" wipes of ANY kind
- Feminine hygiene products
- Diapers and Baby Wipes
- Facial tissues
- Paper towels, cloth towels, and rags



SPRING CLEAN-UP: FRIDAY MAY 12, 2023

Items should be placed at your curb side by 6AM – Friday, May 12th to be picked up.

Villagers should use this opportunity to dispose of large items including furniture and appliances.

Remember to remove doors from items such as refrigerators.

Often several different trucks pick up various items, so all your items may not be picked up at the same time.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

- TIRES
- AIR CONDITIONERS
- COMPUTERS
- MICROWAVES
- TVs

Please do not put these items out.

VILLAGE BURNING GUIDELINES - STEPS TO SAFE BURNING:

- 1. Get a permit: Obtain a free permit online from Wisconsin DNR instantly with an email address. Or call the hotline 1-888-947-2876 from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily to have a burning permit mailed to you.
- 2. Check before burning: After 11 a.m. on the day you wish to burn, check the daily burning restriction and select the county where you plan to burn. Fire conditions change quickly, so it's important to check each day you burn to find out if burning is allowed, burning hours and any size limitations. No burning on Sundays in the Village of Hatley. Weekday burning after 6 p.m. is recommended.
- 3. Follow the rules: Follow the daily burning restrictions and fire safety recommendations listed on the permit. Make sure to have all the necessary tools to keep your fire contained. Lastly, make sure your fire is completely out before leaving. Burn Responsibly or Don't burn at All! **Permits do NOT apply to fire pits.**

This report contains important information about the source and quality of your drinking water. Copies of this report are available for review at the Hatley Library. You may request a copy be mailed you by calling 715-446-2612 and leaving your name and address.

The Village of Hatley Water and Wastewater plant operate under permits issued by the WDR.

The permit renews every 5 years and prior to renewal an overall audit/review is conducted by the DNR. The review pointed out our chloride count is rising. This is common to expect due to the hard water in the Hatley area and the growth the Village of Hatley has experienced in the last 10 years. Many homes have installed water softeners that use salt. The water softeners process the water through salt and the water is recycled through the wastewater plant, salt increases chlorides.

Tips on what each household can do that has a water softener include: (1) set softener on auto cycle; (2) do not plumb softeners in floor drains; (3) have the softener checked regularly so it runs efficiently and limits the use of salt; (4) when purchasing a water softener research buying a NO salt conditioner.


VILLAGE UPDATES:

- Alliant Energy is replacing 30 existing light poles in the Village. Half of the poles have already been replaced and the remainder are in process of being replaced.
- River's Edge Country Living Estates single family home is nearing completion and rented. This completes the number of homes the area has space to accommodate.
- The Village of Hatley completed the purchase of the undeveloped lot adjacent to the Wastewater Treatment plant on Rozy Lane for future WWTP expansion.
- Village TIF revenue is being put to use with a contract for rehabilitation and enhancement of the wastewater clarifier system was awarded to Process Equipment Repair Services, Inc. (PERS) from West Bend, WI. Work on this project will start in late Spring and will take 3 to 4 weeks to complete.

Yard Waste Disposal Dumpster

The yard waste dumpster located at the Hatley Wastewater Treatment Plant will be available for the disposal of yard waste starting April 15th and continuing until November 2022. NO plastic bags, or any other garbage is to be placed in the container. Branches are to be cut to a reasonable length (6 foot or less in length and have diameter of 6 inches or less). In order to make unloading more convenient we are leaving the back dumpster door open. Please place your yard waste to the FRONT of the container, so others that follow you have room to unload as well, rather than having to load over the sides.

The Village is exploring some changes to the yard waste disposal method, however, it may not be available for the 2023 season. Any alterations will be posted on our website.
