Dollar General discount retail store opening in Hatley midyear 2019

Dollar General Corporation with general headquarters located at Goodlettsville, TN has selected to open a 9100 square foot discount retail store at the intersection of County Highway Y and State Road in the Village of Hatley. Dollar General started operations in 1939 and last year had a total of over 15,000 stores in 44 states. In fiscal year 2017 Dollar General had sales of \$23.5 billion, ranking them the 123rd largest company in America according to Fortune 500 Magazine.

A typical Dollar Store stocks between 10,000 and 12,000 units of merchandise in the store consisting of grocery and hardware items from a variety of suppliers. Normal store hours are 8 a.m to 10 p.m. 7 days a week. With the closing of Hedtke's IGA and Esker's Hardware Hank store, retail grocery and hardware availability were greatly reduced. The opening of the Dollar General Store will help fill some of the void left by the closings.

VILLAGE BURNING GUIDELINES

Fire pits for campfires are allowed. Other burning is regulated by the DNR. **An annual burning permit is required** (available at P K Slammers, Pike Lake or Esker's Town & Country, Wittenberg).

Then you must call 1-888-WISBURN each time before you burn to determine if there are any restrictions in the proposed burn area. Complete details are available at dnr.wi.gov/forestry/fire.

Please burn only after 6 p.m. No burning on Sundays. Burning of household garbage & recyclables is strictly prohibited.

BUILDING PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR ANY WORK VALUED OVER \$500

Please be advised constructing fencing in your yard requires a permit. We have had some fences installed without applying for a permit. A permit must be acquired prior to starting installation of the fencing and must comply with the ordinance fencing codes. Contact Zoning Please contact Zoning Administrator Bill Karschney at 446-3571 for your permit or to inquire if a permit is needed for your project.

WINTER STREET PARKING REMINDER: Parking is **NOT ALLOWED** on village streets from 2 AM to 6 AM November 1 - April 1

Villagers should use this opportunity to dispose of large items including furniture & appliances.

Items should be placed at your curb side by 6AM Friday, October 26th.

Remember to remove doors from items such as refrigerators. Often several different trucks pick up various items, so all your items may not be picked up at the same time.

Former Hatley Veneer Mill Redevelopment Project Update.

The site is cleared of the old buildings and the extensive cement work on the property. The demolition contractor discovered additional cement pillars and platforms that were buried under the soil during the demolition process. The contractor advised this is a normal occurrence in project such as ours. The Village, through MSA, our engineering advisors advertised for bids to do the street and utility work on the site. A total of four bids were received and opened on August 30, 2018, the low bidder was Jakes Excavating and Landscaping LLC from Ironwood, MI in the amount of \$382,937.26. One half of the cost is eligible for CDBG Grant funds the Village was awarded for the project. Construction work should be shortly with substantial completion of November 30, 2018. It is anticipated it will to late in the season to pave the street, therefore will let the street surface settle and do the paving in spring 2019. Once this is finished the site will be ready for building of the senior housing units in 2019.

Due to the late heavy snow in April our contractor was delayed several weeks in starting water tower repair work, coupled with losing several days with rain during the summer they were not able to finish all the jobs they had intended to do in 2018.
